Labour Relations in A Globalized World – International Program

In the current global economy, big companies rule the global value chains and worldwide labour forces. Representation of employees' interests faces ever new challenges. The Europäische Akademie der Arbeit in der Universität Frankfurt am Main (EAdA) offers a twelve-month academic program in the heart of Europe with a focus on labour relations and the dynamics shaping the trajectory of the world of work in a global context.



The program offers qualification in labour relations in the context of economics, law, and sociology with theoretical and practical dimensions. Participants will have the chance of advancing their German by attending a four-week intensive German course beforehand in Frankfurt.

The target group of the program is socially-engaged people from Israel who have an interest in pursuing a career in the field of labour relations in trade unions, employers' associations, political parties, public institutions or non-governmental organizations. Both Israel and Germany are forerunners in high-tech industries and innovations. They both have a long history of strong labour movements. By this program, we also aim to contribute to the academic, social and cultural ties between the two countries.

Aims of the International Program

At the end of this program, the participants will have a multifaceted knowledge of labour relations in the contemporary globalized world. They will acknowledge the theoretical underpinnings of the labour market in the context of economics, law and sociology. They will be acquainted with the current economic and social controversies and be able to understand the implications of policies and regulations on the labour market. They will gain up-to-date knowledge of the labour relations in Germany on the spot by visits to trade unions, companies, public institutions and NGOs.

About Us

EAdA is a well-established academic institution with a hundred-year history specialized in education and research in labour relations. We work in close collaboration with German trade unions. The institution was co-initiated by Hugo Sinzheimer, the founding father of the German labour law in the time of Weimar Republic. It aims at enabling employees to realize diverse democratic participation rights in the state, society and companies in their interests. EAdA offers its graduates stronger career chances in the field of labour relations in companies, public institutions, trade unions as well political parties and foundations.

- Minimum two years of work experience
- Knowledge of German (C1)
- Experience or interest in organisations active in labour rights

- Documents: CV, motivation letter, certificates of academic/professional qualifications, proof of engagement in the work of trade unions or related field (if available), proof of language level.
